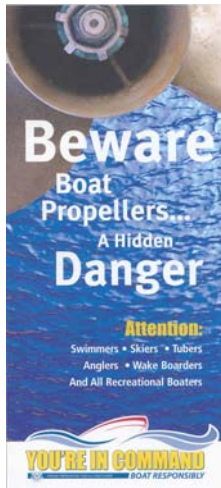

TWO GREAT NEW PIECES FROM YOU'RE IN COMMAND



More and more emphasis is being placed on the risks from propeller injuries and it's the sort of information we should be emphasizing in our recreational boating safety programs. As part of the *You're In Command* effort, two new brochures have been placed in stock at ANSC. The brochure to the left (ANSC# 3033) is an excellent handout to use in all your boating safety classes. Please order sufficient quantities of this pamphlet for each of your classes and perhaps you might think about reading "A Survivor's Account" that you'll find inside. It's a chilling reminder of propeller injury risks.



One of our toughest messages to get across to boaters is the need to WEAR life jackets and not simply carry them on board. Recreational boaters have a preconception that life jackets are bulky, cumbersome, and simply aren't something that would want to wear while underway. This second new pamphlet that's part of the *You're In Command* series illustrates a wide array of life jackets for recreational boaters, high-risk boaters and hunters, sailors, and blue water skippers. As with the propeller injury brochure, order an ample supply of these attractive brochures for all your boating safety education activities and consider both of these for your public affairs activities as well.
